WORKS CITED PAGE GUIDELINES

NOTE ABOUT AUTHORS

Always list the authors in the order they appear on the source.

Single Author: **Last Name, First Name.** For example: DeHaan, Kali.

Two to three authors: **Last Name, First Name, and First Name, Last Name.**

DeHaan, Kali, Kelly Clifford, and Debra Clark.

Four or more authors: **Last Name, First Name, et al.** DeHaan, Kali, et al.

Editor: **Last Name, First Name, ed.** Hackett, Jill, ed.

If the source being cited has no author, move to the next required piece of information (usually the title of the work being cited).
